04/12-02 Motion to amend SR 01/99-03 to read as follows: Beginning with Trials after January 1, 1999, a "Herding Dog of the Year" award will be given to the first ranked Bearded Collie in the Started, Intermediate, and Advanced levels of the AKC Herding Trial Program each year in accordance with the then current AKC Herding regulations. *So that this award is comparable pre and post January 1, 2012 when AKC regulations changed, eligible scores and number of dogs defeated are good for just 60 days after completion of the title in Started and Intermediate levels, and are based on the calendar year after completion of the title in Advanced. The awards are to be given to the four dogs participating in AKC licensed events that attain the highest overall average qualifying score (from all three qualifying runs in attaining the title and the top three qualifying runs in the case of the Championship class) for each of the following classes: Started Class, Intermediate Class, Advanced Class, and Championship Class per any appropriate AKC Regulations at the time. This award shall be given in the year in which the title is earned, *regardless of the year in which the other qualifying runs were obtained*. Ties shall be broken by the average of the number of dogs defeated using the first three qualifying runs under three different judges to obtain the title. (Alspaugh)

The Master's award will be given in the year in which the title is earned and the qualifying runs can come from that and previous years. Ties shall be broken by the average number of dogs defeated in the 8 qualifying runs. Documentation of the Master's title will be from whatever source AKC deems official.

04/12-00 Motion to approve the minutes of the April 21, 2012 meeting. (Alspaugh)

05/12-01 Motion to amend SR 02/95-05 as follows: A "Register of Merit Obedience" (ROMO) is established for Beardie dams producing two or more offspring having a total of at least three obedience titles among such offspring *(at least two regular titles)* and for Beardie sires producing two or more get having a total of at least five obedience titles among such get *(at least three regular titles)*. A "Register of Merit Obedience Excellent" (ROMOX) is established for Beardie dams producing offspring having a total of five or more obedience titles *(at least three regular titles)*. A "Register of Merit Obedience titles *(at least three regular titles)*. A "Register of five or more obedience titles *(at least three regular titles)* and for Beardie sires producing get having a total of ten or more obedience titles *(at least seven regular titles)*. The regular titling classes to be counted toward these awards are CD, CDX, UD, UDX, OM, and OTCh; optional titling classes to be counted are BN, GN, GO, and VER. (Williamson)

Discussion: Amended language in **bold italics**. AKC added three new obedience titles in January 2009 (GN, GO, VER). These titles were added as "optional titling classes," thus, giving the hosting clubs the "option" to offer these classes without requiring that they are offered at all trials. The Beginner Novice (BN) was added in July 2010 and has become a very successful class and is being used by many obedience competitors to get their dogs ring-ready for the CD (the class which was previously the lowest level of obedience offered by the AKC). In 2010 one Bearded Collie earned the BN. In 2011, 20 Beardies competed for the BN and nine Beardies earned the BN. Three of those earning the BN went on to complete the CD title. The Graduate Novice (GN) title can be used for dogs that have a CD and are preparing for the CDX; the Graduate Open (GO) can be utilized by competitors for dogs that have the CDX and are preparing for the UD; and the Versatility (VER) title has exercises from the CD, CDX and UD classes, therefore, dogs competing in this class must be proficient at levels of obedience. We have also included the regular obedience title Obedience Master (OM) which was introduced in 2009.

The BCCA Obedience Committee is attempting to be proactive by including the optional titling classes in our ROMO(X) guidelines. However, we believe that it is important to require that qualifying sires/dams have offspring with a certain number of regular titles, in addition to allowing optional titles to be counted towards the ROMO(X).

CARE AND CONDITIONS POLICY ENHANCED

The AKC announced recent enhancements to its Care and Conditions of Dogs policy. The new policy, which takes effect June 1, 2012, includes a framework for responsible dog ownership including: Care of Dogs, Kennels and Housing and Operations. Anyone, from a single dog owner to a large kennel manager can follow these enhanced guidelines to ensure the best practices of keeping and maintaining dogs.

Enhanced guidelines include: The importance of daily positive human interaction and socialization of dogs; sufficient number of staff must be provided to carry out appropriate levels of care and conditions for the number of dogs kept; each kennel should maintain an emergency preparedness plan adequate for the type of facility owned and breed(s) of dogs maintained there; when euthanasia is necessary, it should always be performed humanely.

The complete Care and Conditions Policy is available on the AKC website at http://www.akc.org/news/index.cfm?article_id=4634 . Please take time to read the entire document. This is a significant step toward improving the inspection and policing of substandard and non-complying kennel operations.

AKC/EUKANUBA NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP OPENED

The AKC/Eukanuba National Championship Show will become an open show awarding Championship and Grand Championship points with this year's show set for December 16-16th 2012 in Orlando, Florida. The top 25 dogs from each breed as well as Bred-By-Exhibitor Champions and other special qualifiers will continue to be celebrated with an invitation granting special recognition.

AKC HUMANE FUND AWARDS FOR CANINE EXCELLENCE

Heroes, like dogs, come in all shapes and sizes. The ACE Award is given to the dog who has performed an exemplary act or acts. The AKC will recognize 5five dogs in the areas of Companion, Law Enforcement, Search and rescue, Therapy, and Service. The dog's heroic act may be large or seemingly small, but must have significantly benefitted a community or individual.

Nominations are now open for the ACE Awards, and the deadline for submission is June 1, 2012. "WHOA THERE!"

Our Beardies are sometimes more than just dogs. Two of my boys were just watching television; they only watch when there is some activity and are really most interested in other animals rather than people. What does this tell us about our dogs?

Mainly that they are triggered into action by the actions of other animals! This then leads to a logical conundrum for them - and us. There need to be a couple of rules for herding livestock safely;

(1) The Beardie needs to STOP when the sheep run, and

(2) Any dog that is at least 3' away from the stock cannot bite that stock!

The natural inclination of any herding dog will be to run faster if the sheep run; this leads to a mad chase and we don't want that. If you will STOP the dog every time the sheep speed up at first, he will learn that it is better to pace the work by himself and this will help him to understand how to do so. Most Beardies will stop when told to; some may need to stay on a lead or line for a while until the dog has learned self-control.

Staying off the sheep does come next, since the speed is such that a human cannot keep up. Once the dog is stopping - either on command or by himself as needed - then you can contribute to the idea of maintaining distance with the commanded stops. If you will initially make your Beardie stay at least 3' off the sheep, he will quickly understand the value of staying off.

*Time 2 Beat is a combination course of Standard and Jumpers With Weaves. While dogs of any skill level are allowed to compete, to be successful you need to demonstrate an advanced level of skills. To earn a T2B title a dog will need 15 Qs and one hundred points. Points are awarded as follows: The first place dog will earn 10 points. All other qualifying dogs with a time that is within 10% of the time of the first place dog (the Time To Beat) will receive 9 points. Within 20% is 8 points, and so on all the way down to 90%.





* I am supportive of therapy dogs, and encourage those who enjoy working with their Beardies toward this worthwhile cause to expand their services. I want to see them receive much support from the club as a whole and look forward to the expansion of this new venue.

* I hope to lead our club through these difficult times and to represent the BCCA as best I can in the current litigation that we find ourselves.

* I am committed to spending the necessary time to accomplish the above goals and to deal with members' questions, concerns, and suggestions. The BCCA exists to serve all members regardless of where their interests lie. (3) I support the investment of club funds to update the coding of the club's web site, allow set up of a secure member's section and simplify electronic handling of routine matters like membership renewal for those members who prefer to carry out this type of business on line. In addition, I would like to see the Beardie competition data that we now must purchase from AKC in order to do the BCCA annual awards be available to members on the web site.

(4) As part of the bylaws revision process, I support creation of a non-voting membership that individuals considering club membership can choose if they wish to.

Belong to Florida Beardie Rescue and BCCA Rescue.

Regional Club Membership/ Activities

No local club nearby, but have belonged to the following clubs, some of which are no longer active: Atlanta Bearded Collie Club; Magnolia Bearded Collie Club; Carolinas Bearded Club; Bearded Collie Club of Central Florida; Bearded Collie Club of Maine; and have application in for the Bearded Collie Club of Southern California. Helped with national specialties put on by these clubs, primarily with judges hospitality and general assistance.

What goals do you think the BCCA needs to pursue and what policies would you suggest to implement these goals?

1. A revision of the by-laws and standing rules is essential. The committee is presently working on this, and at this time it is the top priority. There are standing rules that should be by-laws and by-laws that should be standing rules.

2. I would like to see the BCCA have a Code of Ethics which is reasonable and enforceable. We need to strengthen what we have, but at the same time remember that morality is not something easily legislated. If we are to have a code, there must be reasonable punishment for violations. We can never think of every single thing a member might do, so making it a laundry list is not feasible. I suggest we all view the new AKC Care and Conditions policy for some initial guidance. It is available on the AKC website.

3. I would like to see a better attendance at the annual meeting. I have not researched the cost, but I have attended enough online seminars (which allow participation) to know that it would be possible to have a set-up where those who could not be there in person could participate in the meeting. Those people would not be able to vote, as AKC rules do not allow clubs to conduct business online, but they would be aware of all discussion and hear the reports. I understand that in person attendance is the ideal, and I would hope that as many people as possible would attend, but as we know, the economy has created a bind for a lot of people. We have not had a quorum in years, and that tells me that people don't come unless there is a controversy. We should all attend every meeting if we are on-site.

4. I'd like to see more people attend the Board meetings. The Board represents all of us. Unless they go into executive session to discuss the good name and character of a member, the meetings are open to the membership. The membership needs to know what the board is actually doing and how they conduct business. Members cannot speak, but it's your way to get first hand what goes on.

5. Believe me, compared to many AKC member clubs, the BCCA is in very, very good shape. We have had our ups and downs, but compared to some of the horror stories I have heard from other delegates, we are light years ahead in terms of membership participation and collegiality. We have good people and good dogs. Let's concentrate on the good things and move forward. Showing is always competitive, and those who show are very competitive. But I'd like for us to be more like the attorneys I work with (in several counties): We fight for our clients because we have been hired to do so. But when we leave the courtroom, we don't slam, bang and blame each other because one side or the other didn't win. Win and lose with dignity, not divisiveness. Leave your anger and disappointment at ringside.
