MARCH 2017 AKC DELEGATE REPORT

This meeting was unusual in that many delegates were unable to get to Newark for the meeting or had to stay an extra day because of the weather. Flights were cancelled coming and going, and the weather was frigid. Newark and New York City avoided the heavy snow predicted, but the gale force winds and single digit temps were enough to create havoc with travel plans.

Chairman's Report

As forecast by board chairman, Ron Menaker, companion and performance events are growing in popularity. People want to do something that is fun with their pure-bred dogs, and the public loves to attend events that are showing dogs doing more than just showing off their beauty, like racing, dock-diving, herding, jumping over hurdles, going down holes, and through tunnels. These attractive events are growing in entries as well as spectators, while the entries in conformation are continuing to fall.

Canine Good Citizen titles are also growing with over 54,000 to date. Dogs with CGC titles are welcome in many more hotels, motels, and restaurants. In addition to recognized training clubs, CGC training can be had at many Petco stores through out the country.

The registration of AKC litters is up 6%. Individual dog registrations are up 8% and Bred with HEART breeders (those who have been inspected, met breed health requirements, and passed a written test) have reached the 2000 mark. There are now 786 AKC Breeders of Merit.

Financial Report

Financially, the AKC has turned around their decline and is in a positive situation. They have increased staff in areas of event organization, government relations, and social media presence. They urge all parent clubs to have a website, and to make it friendly for the public. A website needs to serve the members of the club, and to inform the public of the virtues of the breed, and let them know how to obtain a puppy.

Rita Biddle, Dominic Carota, Tom Powers, and Harvey Wooding were elected to the AKC Board of Directors after five rounds of voting by the delegates. The bad weather caused many delegates who drove to the meeting to leave a day early, missing the balloting. Out of 600 delegates only 190 were present.

Other business included a PAC report of \$53,000 with 46% of that amount coming from parent clubs like ours. The Lagotto

Club of America was admitted, new delegates introduced, and two rules involving hunting dogs were amended.

The Canine Health Foundation received \$750,000 from AKC this past year in matching grants. This was distributed as follows: \$250,000 for tick-borne disease studies, \$250,000 for studies on epilepsy, and \$250,000 in various other areas. The CHF will hold its annual parent club conference in St. Louis in August.

Bylaws Committee

The following items were discussed at the Bylaws committee meeting:

- 1. Nominating Committee Proposal: Do we need one? If not, what happens if we do not have enough self-nominations? An ongoing discussion.
- 2. Standing Rule re: Delegate Committees
- 3. Clarification of wording in the bylaws.
- 4. Term limits for Committee Members and Committee Chairs.

Parent Club Committee

There were quite a number of items set for discussion, some of which are on the agenda each month.

- 1. If funding can be obtained, the Parent Club Committee is hoping to host another Parent Club Conference. I attended the one in Atlanta several years ago and spoke on Liability for Rescue Groups. Carol Sirrine also attended.
- 2. Parent Club Rescue Placement on AKC Marketplace
- 3. Group Realignment/Reassessment
- 4. Junior Showmanship...Parent clubs need to work hard to encourage juniors to participate in conformation, and especially to become good sports in any competition.
- 5. The AKC continues to work with clubs in evaluations and storing their archives. This is important for the history of each breed and the clubs which represent them. Contact AKC for more information.
- 6. Parent Club Self-Evaluation: It is my understanding that the BCCA has completed this process.

The next meeting will be held at the Newark Airport Hilton Doubletree Hotel on June 12-13, 2017.

TRAINING TIDBITS, Elsa Sell, Herding Chair • beaconbb@bellsouth.net

Our local herding club held a clinic with Terry Wofford (Florida) Monday after the recent two day trial. There were 11 dogs – four Beardies (yea – Andrea Hobe with one; Suzanne O'Malley with two, and me, one), one1 Aussie, the rest border collies. Terry had been a stock handler for the trials and knew each dog's issues. He started the clinic by saying he doesn't course train. He works on skills to successfully manage stock so each of us should come with our foremost problem.

GOING AROUND THE C CONE IN ADVANCED

The set up was going around the cone clockwise. The handler thought the problem was that dog was refusing to take an away flank once sheep were started around cone. She showed how the task had been approached, beginning with her standing quite close to the cone. Dog brought sheep up nicely and started them around the cone and she rotated with them, still standing very close to the cone. At about 12 o'clock she asked dog to stop and flank on an away, thus leaving from the drive toward the mouth of the Y. Oops, didn't work.

Solutions. Handler sets up dog to start outrun, then steps to the opposite side of the cone AND a stock stick's length away (about five feet). Once sheep have been driven to cone and are ready to go around, handler begins to rotate clockwise BUT stays about same stick length distance from cone, dog drives sheep around clockwise; at about 12 o'clock, she forgot to continue her own and dog's rotation clockwise – sent dog away, sheep lost direction and drifted toward wrong end of Y. Sound familiar? Loss of control still happening. Next time, dog is kept going clockwise to one-two o'clock (handler too) to assure that sheep are clearly committed to move toward mouth of Y but not so far as to turn them down toward exit. At that point, dog may stop briefly or continue a little more drive to assure sheep definitely commit to Y. Then an away flank and dog reverses direction to

get to the other side and finish the drive to mouth of Y and into the Y. It worked quite well.

NOT MAINTAINING POSITION BEHIND SHEEP WITH FETCHING

(PT, started). Problem – pushiness or worry about escape? For this dog, the stop was a down; could be stand or sit. Handler starts by leaving dog and walking toward sheep (oops, dog doesn't maintain stay and needed to fix that – dog needs to learn when left it is to remain there until asked to move). Once about halfway to sheep, send dog to get behind sheep and handler goes to sheep and starts fetch. Dog maintains fetch for short distance, then pushes too hard and sheep bolt ahead. Solution – ask dog to steady (if they know that word) or stop. But dog doesn't stop. Why? Ignoring handler or handler's message not understood. How to fix? Terry uses a rolled dog food or grain bag with duct tape in 3 places around outside. It is light and easy to carry several extras along under one arm. Handler has one in hand and says stop and whacks the roll against own leg. It may take more than once or even stepping into the dog when introducing the technique. The dog (my Heidi) was especially sound sensitive this day and I worried she would leave at the sound. Nope. She startled and after second whack on my leg, down she went softly. Walk on with sheep, dog up – nope, didn't yet ask for walk; whack/down, nice soft down. Walk some more, then reverse direction into dog who automatically flanks around.

On the flank in the away direction, she stayed off and dropped in behind. Whack/stop. Why? To allow handler to walk away with sheep and dog remain in place. Repeat the stop, walk sequence; then reverse direction. Now dog is flanking in come bye direction; oops, the weak side. What happens? Slice in and mess things up. Solution? As you turn you don't go all 180 in the opposite direction; stay turned so you can see what dog is

doing and step into dog (out) if slice is to start. Once correctly around, dog walks peacefully only a few steps, then gets pushy. Whack/down. Walk off with sheep, insisting on down until walk up is asked for. Whichever direction one turns in, once the dog has dropped in behind sheep, down. Handler walks away then asks for walk up. AM session she was somewhat unhappy when finished. PM session – she came in happy, fetches were longer with less pushing, stops held consistently, improved weak side flanks.

Summary of skills worked on: stay, understanding (and handler understanding how to obtain) and maintaining stop, slice in from weak side direction, pushing too much especially on weak side, learning sheep didn't leave if she didn't push too hard. **Side benefit**: no hands to hold stock stick. Since it is supposed to be to protect one from stock and NOT to give direction to dog, I didn't miss it one iota. Next day at home, I asked unexpectedly for a down while Heidi was standing in a doorway; she looked up, took a second, and softly went down with wagging tail.

SHED IN ADVANCED B COURSES

Basics: 1) handler must see the potential shed develop (the grouping of the stock into two groups) before can ask for it, 2) dog must reliably come in immediately and directly to the handler's hand which indicates the place to come through. There had been several missed sheds in the trial because of repeated failure to come in immediately. The shed was practiced in round pen first against the panels, then in the middle which is harder. If done with a larger group of stock initially, it is easier to see the separation developing and thus easier to teach that come in to hand.

OUTRUN IN STARTED A COURSE.

The setup was for outrun in the clockwise (come bye) direction. The dog had run straight down along the panels both days of the trial, the runs were wrecks and didn't proceed beyond the beginning.

Basics: 1) Place dog at B cone facing in direction it should travel. Why? If dog is set up facing in the stock's direction, the likelihood of running straight at stock is much greater. 2) Dog stays while (if) handler walks toward the A cone. Why? Premature departure usually ends with run straight into stock. Must have that stay. 3) Handler walks on the come bye side of the center panels to whatever place you stop, send dog and walk over in front of sheep set out. Why? Staying on the side where the dog begins the outrun allows you if need be, to step into dog to push it out (rule book: once dog starts moving, handler can roam anywhere above the horizontal line through the A cone). That would be handler assistance, but far better than straight into the stock. Once dog arrives behind the sheep, a stop command (or there) for a brief pause and then move on. The dog started several times facing the sheep and sure enough, demonstrated a straight run into the sheep

THERE

Different trainers use the word "there" to mean different things. Terry trains the meaning of "there" to become down for his own dogs; hit the ground and wait for further direction from me. Early on, the command is "there, down" and in time as soon as the dog hears "there", it downs and holds the down until the next command.

FREQUENCY OF COMMANDS

Once a command is learned, then it should be a single command followed by response. Terry says, none of these five "down" stops. That is handler assistance to many judges; to the dog it is meaningless babble.

DOG PULLS ON LINE WHILE WALKING WITH YOU.

Terry's solution is to have the dog down when it pulls and to repeat this every time the dog starts to pull. It might also be done with another command if the dog has been taught that it (e.g., stop, sit, stand) truly means STOP.

HOW TO ENTER A GATE

Have dog on the latch side and let dog enter first for control if there is stock inside and safety. Especially important if the stock (happens more with cattle) has a habit of wanting to depart through any gate opening. If stock comes at the gate as dog is going in, you have a hand on the gate and can close it. You will be safe and stock won't escape.

HOW TO RECOGNIZE DOG FEELING STOCK PRESSURE

This was practiced with several in round pen. Have dog on line, walk straight into the still group of stock. Once dog stops moving or begins to agitate (bark, turn, or whatever), it is feeling too much pressure. Try to hold it there briefly, then turn 180 and walk away. Brief break, then walk in again until the signs of pressure and stop. Hold. Walk away and repeat. Dog will often be able to be closer after the first time or two before feeling the pressure. Andrea's Brock demonstrated this nicely.

HOW TO DEAL WITH AN OBNOXIOUS SHEEP

Suzanne and Maggie were working in the arena with fetching. After one change of direction, Maggie got in a bit too close. One of the sheep didn't like this at all and turned to Maggie and walked after her, head down. This happened several times and the sheep went after Maggie; she was pretty unhappy and worried. To resolve the issue so she could leave on a happy note, Terry got his dog and put him on the sheep to to remind them that going after a dog wasn't wise. Maggie was better. When she returned in the PM session, she was quite cheerful and not worried – did her work with gusto. It is important to help the dog in this situation so they regain the confidence.

OTHER WISE ADVICE

Before you start a run in a trial it is important to look at the set up to notice shadow locations, panel types, know how the exhaust pen gate works (do this in the handler's meeting), uneven ground, ant hills. Don't just go in and look around once you start the run – it may be too late to avoid a lurking problem.

For any of the exercises described that have directional changes, obviously one practices at home in both directions and more on the weaker side.

When sending dog to go around sheep informally (not from a cone for example), there should be a straight line from dog thru handler to sheep. Why? If handler stands to one side of the other of the line, it opens up a nice straight pathway for dog to go directly at sheep. How many of us have wondered why this happened? The handler's presence on the line blocks the dog. This was demonstrated by several dogs at the clinic.

Carol has given grooming seminars and trained conformation and puppy obedience classes. Two years ago, she retired from a 28-year sole ownership of Honeyblossom Farm Dog Training, where she taught obedience and conformation. Currently, she is the conformation instructor at Stone City Kennel Club in new Lenox, Illinois. She has been mentored in Bearded Collies and is currently waiting AKC approval.

Robert H. Slay • A.M. Regular Classes

Bob resides in Cary, North Carolina. He is a graduate of the University of Southern Mississippi and the US Naval Officers School. Bob was elected Vice-President of the AKC and served until retirement in 2004. He was state chairman of the Morris Animal Foundation and was a member of the original Steering Committee for the Dog Museum of America. Purebred dogs have been a major part of Bob's life for over 40 years. The Slays bred, owned, and showed German Shepherds. Bob served as President and Show Chairman for several all-breed and Specialty Clubs. He is currently President of the Cary Kennel Club. Bob has judged throughout the US and overseas. He is currently approved to judge all Sporting, Working, and Herding breeds plus 8 Terrier breeds.

Cynthia Mahigian Moorhead, Parchment Farms Bearded Collies • P.M. Regular Classes

Cynthia has had Bearded Collies since 1972 and intentionally maintained a small, but idealistic breeding program while concentrating from the very first on being a judge. She has produced champions from each litter that she has bred or co-bred, and has finished championships on every dog she has ever shown. Cynthia has been a licensed AKC judge for Beardies since 1984, when she became the first person licensed to judge the breed solely based on knowledge of the breed (having never owned another breed prior) and she has judged virtually all over the US and in Canada at all levels of competition from match to point shows. (Cynthia has never charged to judge Bearded Collies, a promise made to herself with her first assignment); as she states, "it's a privilege to be able to do what I love best in the ring"). In 1984 Cynthia judged the Sweepstakes at the BCCA National. One year later did the same for the Canadian BCC. In 1988 she judged the BCCA's National Specialty, the first-American breeder-judge to do so; as well she judged the 1993 Specialty, making her the first American breeder-judge to repeat that honor. She has twice been honored to judge at North of England Bearded Collie Club's Open Show, one of a handful of American breeder-judges to judge the breed in England. Cynthia belongs to both the Senior Conformation Judges of America Association and the Dog Judges of America Association. She currently lives with two Beardie boys, Ramsay and Oliver, down from 14 at one time.
