Hello! My name is Michelle Panno. I'm 15 and live in Illinois. The Juniors' competition is very tough in this area. I've been in Open Sr. for about a year. Before I got my Beardie, I showed Shelties and Boxers. My Beardie puppy came from Chris and Ed Walkowicz. They have been totally supportive of me in anything I do.

I love the breed! The personality, size, flashiness, and love of showing make Beardies the perfect dog for Juniors (and group, too!). I hope to stay in this breed and other working and herding dogs, possibly handling professionally someday!

I owe an awful lot to a Boxer breeder named Donna Titus who has taught me so much. There are so many handlers who will help you if you only ask when they're not busy. I think Juniors does an excellent job of preparing you for the breed ring. It not only develops your handling skills but also your confidence in yourself and in your dog. Attitude is so very important! I can't emphasize it enough! Believe in yourself and your dog always!

I started showing one of our Collies, and almost always got a ribbon, but I didn't win. I worked hard; and as I improved, I changed to a Springer Spaniel, named Bess. With practice and experience the ribbons got higher, and I even won some firsts.

With Bess, I made it to open competition as a Junior, and we decided I had enough experience to start showing one of our Bearded Collies. I started with our bitch, Ch.
