**Crufts!**

Crufts! The very thought of making a trip to England to see it sends shivers of anticipation down most spines. Upwards of 10,000 dogs and about 200 concession booths make Crufts a spectator's dream. Breeders work throughout the year to qualify one or more of their dogs for Crufts. The requirements for qualification ensure that the spectator sees the "cream of the crop" that England has to offer.

This year Mary Jo and I attended our first Crufts. Crufts expanded to four days this year to accommodate the 14,685 entries. We were pleased to find that the 197 Beardies would be shown on Thursday, leaving us the week to try and visit some Beardie kennels. We were in our ringside seats at 8:30, camera in hand, waiting for the 9:00 start time. Our seats actually made the ring barriers. There were no ropes or gates to define the rings at Crufts, only chairs.

We were impressed right off with the way the puppies looked. No one misbehaved or was shown in an in-between coat. They were gorgeous. As class after class came into the ring we noticed some differences between the English and American Beardies. Their dogs are longer, more nearly conforming to the desired 5/4 ratio. The body length was in the ribcage and not the loin except for a few cases. The heads were beautiful. They seemed to be a blockier head than some you see here. The movement was freer and long-reaching. The feet were only lifted high enough to propel the dog forwards. Most had lovely straight fronts. The English Beardies seem to age better than ours. We saw many 10- and 11-year-olds who could easily pass for 5. Thirteen-year-old English
