We are excited to host the 2021 Breed Education Seminar with Dr. Jerold Bell; the seminar is sponsored by the Bearded Collie Club of America Charitable Trust,

This is an incredible opportunity for the breed and should not be missed. Dr. Bell's presentation is focused on the genetic diversity of the Bearded Collie, particularly within the United States.

Dr. Bell is reviewing information provided by the BCCA regarding breed health. He will contact any researchers identified by the BCCA to be working on health issues pertaining to the Bearded Collie, and will explain in laymen's terms any specific facts or recommendations based on current research. He will also research any other genetic disorders reported in the breed and report his findings during the seminar.

The goal of the seminar is to educate and inform breeders and breed enthusiasts about genetic disease — as well as the genetic diversity of the breed — to aid in future breeding choices and, in turn, improve the health and longevity of the breed.

Dr. Bell is a veterinarian and professor at Tufts University, with an expertise in genetics. He has presented similar seminars for other breeds. You can view some of his previous seminars on YouTube, if you are interested in seeing what his seminar will entail. The seminar should allow for a question-and-answer session.

Last spring I put a Beginner Novice by video or BN-V on one of my Beardies. When her title published, I noticed that AKC listed it, not at the beginning of her title list where obedience titles are normally placed, but at the end with the miscellaneous titles. I found that curious so when I was ready to enter this dog in rally advanced, I wrote to AKC and asked if having a BN-V made her ineligible for rally Advanced A and rally Excellent A as having earned a BN or any other regular obedience title would. Their answer was a dog with a BN-V CAN enter the A classes in rally. Something to keep in mind if you decide to earn a BN-V...it's NOT an obedience title!

Due to the partial support of BeaCon for Health, Dr. Bell's presentation will be videotaped, and the BCCA will make the video available to those interested. Details about how to obtain the video will be made available after the National Specialty.

Note: Dr. Bell's presentation is expected to run three hours. A short break will be provided in the middle. We intend to provide at least a one-hour break between the conclusion of obedience and rally competition and the start of the health seminar.

PENNY'S AGILITY "WORLD TOUR"

I started calling Penny "Rockstar" about two years ago, not for the reason you might think. We weren't bringing home placement rosettes or even Q ribbons. Thanks to trial stress/arousal/distractions (whatever you want to label it), we were always one A-frame contact or weave pole away from the elusive green Q ribbon. I jokingly told my husband I was going to order a bunch of AQ ribbons and award them to myself because we had so many "Almost Qs."

But I realized two things. One was that she was the hardest working Beardie I have ever had. Training and trials weren't always easy for us. But even when it was hard, Penny would run the course and give me everything she had. Two, she was having fun and running great in Masters!

Penny is not my first agility Beardie. But due to some health issues and injuries with my first, Penny was my first to run in Masters and I couldn't believe we made it to that level. Qs were hard to come by thanks to the



A-frame and weave poles but we enjoyed the game and were learning a lot and having fun. She was my Rockstar and I was so proud of her. And so, the nickname stuck. When I step to the line with her I tell her we are going to have fun and do our best and see what we can do today. No pressure. No expectations. And she always surprises me. It's funny how once I stopped thinking about what we couldn't do (like that darn A-frame contact) and focusing on all the good things we could do, then more good

things started happening. Which brings me to our "World Tour". While most will remember 2020 as the year of Covid, I will remember it as my year of Penny and so many firsts for both of us. Never in my wildest dreams did I think we would be attending a big AKC agility event, let alone earning our very first MACH. When one big event invite turned into two and then three, we jokingly started referring to them all as Rockstar Penny's "Agility World Tour." We didn't exactly travel the world, but I did do a lot of driving, and had a blast!

Technically it started at the end of 2019 when we qualified for the 2020 National AKC Agility Championship in Perry, Georgia in March 2020. The event ended up getting canceled due to COVID, but of all our big events it is the one I am most proud of. We had just earned our excellent titles in December of 2018, so earning the 7QQs and 550 points by the November 30th deadline to qualify for the 2020 Nationals was such a thrill. And while we didn't get to go, I did get to order way too much logowear to celebrate our very first invite to Nationals!

Our tour officially started in Orlando in December 2020. In August, we received a second round invite to the 2020 AKC Agility Invationals which was a huge surprise. We had ended the qualification period as the #7 Beardie. Not knowing for sure if the event would happen, but also knowing this could be our one and only chance to attend, we accepted the invite and hoped it would happen. We had gone to the event in 2015 as spectators to watch Penny's breeder, Andrea Hobe, compete with Penny's mom, Brie. If you had told me that one day I would be back with Penny, I wouldn't have believed you but off we went in 2020. It was different, because of COVID many decided not to attend so it was much smaller and quieter! The COVID protocols they had in place were great and I couldn't have felt safer. There were no spectators and you couldn't bring any unentered dogs so it was just me and Penny. We normally travel with at least one of my other beardies, but it was nice to be there with just Penny and celebrate all of her successes that year with just the two of us. I had no idea how she would do in that type of big event environment, but to me it was a reward for all of her hard work to just be there. We were going to have fun and enjoy it, and we did! Penny exceeded my expectations with four amazing runs. I'll admit I was hoping for just one souvenir Q ribbon and she gave me two! Her other two runs were great too, they were Almost Qs - with one excited A-frame fly off in Hybrid (which was actually my favorite run) and one missed pole in the weaves in Standard due to a distraction outside the ring right next to the poles. (But she got her contacts so I was thrilled). While I opted for safety and avoided the shopping because it was in the conformation area, I still ordered lots of logowear!

Then it was off to Tulsa, OK in March 2021 for the 2020/2021 National AKC Agility Championship and the second leg of our tour. We had been given a bye because we had qualified and entered the year before. But we qualified again for the 2021 event which had modified qualification criteria due to the lack of trials that year. So of course I had to buy the 2021 logo wear too! Nationals is a much bigger event so it felt a lot different than Orlando. There were multiple arenas and dirt rings. Still not as many exhibitors as a normal year due to COVID, but it felt like a huge trial to us. Once again the AKC did a great job keeping the exhibitors safe. Any exhibitor, including myself, were able to get vaccinated prior to the event. We still had to wear masks inside and outside and no spectators allowed, but because we rented a barn stall for crating I was able to bring Charm, Penny's new



little sister (10 months old at the time) who is Penny's biggest fan and groupie. Because the arenas were so spread out, the biggest challenge was getting from the building with the stalls to all of the arenas. I wasn't used to a 10 minute walk to the ring. I loved the venue; we are used to running on dirt in these types of arenas and everything was indoors, although one of the buildings had a wall of windows that looked out over a very busy parking lot. So instead of flying off the a frame like she often does, Penny stood at the top to investigate and make sure all was safe for a good 10 seconds. I thought she might never come down! The A-frame was towards the end of the course and the first two thirds of the course was super challenging; Penny had nailed it up until that point. So

once she came down all I could do was laugh.

Again, I was so proud of her. She had two more great runs and we came home with one souvenir Q ribbon. I thought these courses were more challenging than the Invitational courses; I couldn't have been happier with how well she did.

Our third tour leg was the Masters Agility Championship at Westminster in June 2021. From the moment I told my husband that they had moved the event from February to June and that it was going to be at Lyndurst Mansion and not downtown NYC (although I would later learn that Lyndhurst mansion was still super close to NYC and only looked like it was in the country), he said I had to go. He said it was a once in a lifetime because he knew I could never drive from Alabama to NYC in the snow and ice and because Penny would have hated all the traffic and noise of NYC. He and almost everyone in my family (who don't know much about agility but definitely know about Westminster) were more excited about the possibility of this event than any of the others. So I agreed to enter, although I didn't think we'd ever get in. But we did. We drove 15 hours each way for one day of agility and two runs! It seemed a little crazy but what a fun experience (except for the last hour of the drive over the George Washington Bridge and into NYC to our hotel in Yonkers!). The premium stated the event was to be held in tents. JWW was held in an outdoor tent which is what I expected. For Penny, it was probably the most challenging environment she has ever had to run in; it was open on all sides and right next to the only road that went in and out of the grounds with a constant stream of cars and trucks. A garbage truck went by as we were waiting to go in the ring and Penny started trembling. I had no idea if she would run. But as I said earlier, she always gives me everything she can. I skipped our normal start line and just took her collar and said "Let's go!" Off she went and I was so happy! The fourth obstacle was a tunnel, when she came out she started noticing all of the distractions again. BUT, she stayed on course and ran the entire course. Although she stopped at a few jumps to look around and make sure everything was ok, she then took the jump (after a lot of cheerleading by me) and kept going. She dropped two bars as a result, but never ran around a jump or ran off course. I was so so proud that she completed

the course. The Standard course was in the big tent and you would have never known you were in a tent. You felt like you were in Madison Square Garden with the purple and yellow, all the lights and cameras and your dog's name and run time on the Jumbotron when you ran. It was the same ring that was used for the televised agility and conformation finals and it was amazing. I knew Penny would be much happier in that ring and she was. She took off like a rocket, which I wasn't expecting, so we had an off course. And she was as star struck as I was and looking around as she ran and not paying attention and she slipped off the teeter. Something that has never happened to us before. But the rest of her run was beautiful and she got her A-frame contact at Westminster! Woo hoo! No souvenir ribbon as a result but I bought more than enough purple logo wear. It was such a unique experience, I'm so glad we went. Everywhere I looked I saw the Westminster logo; I felt like I



was someplace really special. Running under the lights in the standard ring made the whole trip worth it.

After returning from Westminster on Sunday, we turned around on Tuesday and headed to Purina for the BCCA National, to wrap up our tour, play and celebrate with our Beardie friends and family. Penny loves running at Purina with only Beardies, so it was her big reward for all of her hard work. She even got a QQ! We finished the event off by receiving her 2019 BCCA Denia Award and her BCCA Master of Versatility award which she earned after getting her MACH last September. And the biggest surprise was being awarded the BAD Member of the Year for all that we had accomplished the past year. What a year it has been! I am so thankful for my AllAround girl and for everyone who has supported us along the way.

HERDING NEWS

From the 2020 National Specialty Herding Event, there are two new Herding Instinct Certified Beardies – congratulations to Blackburn's The Big Easy, owned by Gretchen and Darron Blackburn and Tweeddales Black As The Ace of Spades, owned by Deborah Alexander.

Safe travels and good fortune to those attending the BCCA 2021 National Herding Trials in September. Remember to keep your copies of the judge's sheet, ribbons, and event photos if you do those – reason below.

Did you receive your dog's herding title certificate from AKC? You and your Beardie have worked hard for this, so be sure that you get the credit.

It has been several years since there were issues with receipt of title certificates or recording of qualifying runs, but one was reported in the first quarter of 2021. The Beardie has the required three qualifying runs under two different judges recorded in the AKC quarterly report (1st quarter), but no title recorded in the monthly titles report and the owner received no title certificate.

If this happened to you, would you know how to problem solve? If yes, great. If not, read on:

Keep track of your dog's qualifying runs, check the same on AKC's website, and check the BCCA herding database at

user name - 9GC,6n/BiXW

This is the generic login to search for information (note, to change info you will need to contact me). It is best to copy/paste the url, use name and password to avoid errors.

Why check here? You need to verify that both qualifying runs and titles are credited to your Beardie in the BCCA herding

database *because that is the source used to tally annual BCCA herding awards.*

When to check the BCCA herding database.

AKC quarterly reports of qualifying runs are received by the herding committee mid-month in April, July, October, and January. Qualifying data are usually in the database by the end of those months.

AKC new title reports are received by the club in the last half of a month, then distributed to committees. Title data are usually in the database by the beginning of the next month; the data are also in the following month's Bagpipes new titles section.

Timing of when to check AKC site. I don't know how quickly trial results are available on the AKC site – but AKC posts events both processed and not yet processed.

To report errors or omissions on the dog's points on AKC website reporting errors or omissions.

Contact AKC @ 919-233-9767

Option 4 to check all events including points, results, or awards

Then option 1 to check event points and awards,

Or option 5 for performance division to speak to a person and tell them you haven't received the title certificate

IF YOUR HAVE MOVED, it is your responsibility to notify AKC about your address change. Otherwise your certificate will have been mailed to the address on record. AKC doesn't access address info on premium entry forms (which go to the show superintendent or secretary.)

Report errors or omissions to both AKC and to me. I will contact the report division if this involves a missing title.

What is Fast CAT?

American Kennel Club's newest sport for dogs and those who love them is called Fast CAT. This is a 100-yard straight course run where dogs run individually and earn points that are calculated by multiplying their mph by their height-based handicap. The handicap system works like this:

Handicap of 2.0 for dogs below 12 inches at the withers

Handicap of 1.5 for dogs 18 inches or greater at the withers

Handicap of 1.0 for dogs 18 inches or greater at the withers

Dogs earn suffix titles based on a point system. The faster the dog runs and the more qualifying runs a dog does, the better its chances to earn titles and collect ridiculously large rosette ribbons. (Yes, the title ribbons awarded rival best in show rosettes!)

Here's how titles are awarded

150 points for BCAT

500 points for DCAT

1,000 points for FCAT

500 points for additional FCATs (FCAT1, FCAT2, FCAT3...)

So, how does it work?

Each Fast CAT race team has a "releaser" positioned at the starting line and a "catcher" at the catch zone. The person your dog loves best is usually at the finish line. When the lure, a white plastic bag, takes off, an electronic timer starts when your dog crosses the start line. The lure is pulled by an electronic pulley system.

Who is the fastest dog in the country? You'll find out at the AKC Fast CAT Invitational where the country's speediest canines gather for an invitation-only event. For those who are into stats and bragging rights, the first and second place dogs in the AKC Top 20 Fastest Dogs breed rankings get an invitation to the annual AKC Fast CAT Invitationals!

This is a sport that your dog doesn't have to go to training classes for. If you want to work with your dog, an easy way to do this is to tie a plastic shopping bag to the end of a long stick/pole and drag it around the yard.



Fast CAT activities are open to all breeds no matter the size. The only requirement is your dog must be at 12 months old including mixed breeds. If you're new to the sport, most venues offer a "Fun Run" opportunity which is a great way to see if this is something your Bearded finds more fun than chasing squirrels in the yard.

At a trial, the first thing you will do is sign in and go through an "inspection" to have your dog checked for lameness, fitness to compete, and females in season.

Each club will have their own way of organizing the run order. Hint: Be

sure to have your catcher at the finish line long before your dog's number is called. 100 yards is a long way away and you don't want to be "that one" that holds up the trial because you're not down there ready to catch your dog.

What are you waiting for?

Once your dog discovers how much fun Fast CAT is, you'll want to go to a trial every weekend. Clubs typically host four trials in a weekend — two on one day and two the next. This gives you the chance to "race" to collect points for your titles. Some dogs take a leisurely stroll from one end to the other and others will give you whiplash watching them haul it to the finish line. Bring a tent for shade, lawn chair, refreshments and enjoy the day. Check out the link below for all things Fast CAT.

BREEDING STRATEGIES FOR MANAGING GENETIC TRAITS

With each new generation of dogs, breeders ask, “How can I continue my line and improve it?” Aside from selecting for conformation, behavior and ability, breeders must consider how they are going to reduce the incidence of whichever genetic disorders are present in their breed. There are no answers that will fit every situation. There are, however, guidelines you can follow to preserve breeding lines and genetic diversity while reducing the risk of producing dogs that carry defective genes, or are affected with genetic defects.

Autosomal Recessive Disorders

In the case of a simple autosomal recessive disorder for which a test for carriers is available, the recommendation is to test your breeding-quality stock, and breed carriers to normal-testing dogs. The aim is to replace the carrier breeding-animal with a normal-testing offspring that equals or exceeds it in quality. You don’t want to diminish breed diversity by eliminating quality dogs from the gene pool because they are carriers. As each breeder tests and replaces carrier dogs with normal-testing dogs, the problem for the breed as a whole diminishes.

For some disorders there are tests known as linkage-based carrier tests, which can generate a small percentage of false positive and negative results. When using these tests to make breeding decisions, it’s advisable to first determine whether the results correlate with the test results and known genotypes of relatives.

When dealing with a simple autosomal recessive disorder for which no carrier test exists, breeders must assess whether each individual dog in their breeding program is at high risk of being a carrier. This requires knowledge of the carrier or affected status of close relatives in the pedigree. An open health registry that is supported by the parent club makes it easier for breeders to objectively assess these matters. By determining the average carrier-risk for the breeding population, breeders can select matings that have a projected risk which is lower than the breed average.

If breeding a dog that is at high risk of being a carrier, the best advice is to breed to a dog that has a low risk. This will significantly diminish the likelihood that affected dogs will be produced, and can reduce by up to half the risk that there will be carriers among the offspring. Using relative-risk assessment as a tool, breeders should replace higher-risk breeding dogs with lower-risk offspring that are equal to or better than their parents in quality. Relative-risk assessment allows for the continuation of lines that might otherwise be abandoned due to high carrier risk.

Breeding a dog only once and replacing it with an offspring allows breeders to improve their chances of moving away from defective genes and also limits the dissemination of defective genes. When dealing with disorders for which carriers cannot be identified, the number of offspring placed in breeding homes should be kept to a minimum.

Autosomal Dominant Disorders

Autosomal dominant genetic disorders are usually easy to manage. Each affected dog has at least one affected parent, but it can be expected that half of the offspring of an affected dog will be free of the defective gene. With disorders that cause death or discomfort, the recommendation is to not breed affected dogs. To produce the next generation of a line, a normal full sibling of an affected dog can be used, or the parent that is normal can be used.

A problem with some autosomal dominant disorders is incomplete penetrance. In other words, some dogs with the defective gene may not show the disorder. Roughly half their offspring, however, may be affected. If a genetic test is available, this is not a problem. Otherwise, relative-risk assessment can identify which dogs are at risk of carrying incompletely penetrant dominant genes.

Sex-Linked Disorders

For sex-linked (also known as x-linked) recessive defective genes for which carrier tests exist, breeders should follow the same “breed and replace” recommendations as are outlined above in the discussion of autosomal recessive disorders. If there is no test, the defective gene can be traced through the pedigree. If a male is affected, he would have received the defective gene from his carrier mother. All of his daughters will be carriers, but none of his sons. By using relative-risk assessment to breed him to a female that is at low risk of being a carrier, you can prevent affected offspring, and select a quality son for replacement.

There are rare instances in which a female is affected with a sex-linked disorder. In such cases, she would have received the defective gene from both parents; specifically, an affected father and a mother who is either a carrier or is affected herself. If an affected female is bred, all the sons will be affected, and all the daughters would be carriers, so affected females clearly should not be bred. A normal male that is a littermate to an affected female, however, would be able to carry on the line without propagating the defective gene.

Sex-linked dominant disorders are managed the same way as autosomal dominant disorders are. The difference is that affected males will always produce all affected daughters.

Polygenic disorders

Polygenic disorders are those caused by more than one pair of genes. Most polygenic disorders have no tests for carriers, but they do have phenotypic tests that can identify affected dogs.

With polygenic disorders, a number of genes must combine to cross a threshold and produce an affected dog. These are known as liability genes. In identifying a dog's liability for carrying defective genes for a polygenic disorder, the breadth of the pedigree (that is, consideration of all siblings of individuals in the pedigree) is more important than the depth of the pedigree (consideration only of parent-offspring relationships.) A clinically normal dog from a litter that had one or no individuals affected with hip dysplasia (which is a polygenic disorder) is expected to carry a lower amount of liability genes than a dog with a greater number of affected littermates. This is why it is important to screen both pet and breeding dogs from your litters for polygenic disorders. Information

on the siblings of the parents of potential breeding dogs provides additional data on which to base your breeding decisions.

Genetic disorders without a known mode of inheritance should be managed in the same way as polygenic disorders. If there are multiple generations of normalcy in the breadth of the pedigree, then you can have some confidence that there are less liability genes being carried. If a dog is diagnosed with a genetic disorder, it can be replaced with a normal sibling or parent and bred to a mate whose risk of having liability genes is low. Replace the higher-risk parent with a lower-risk offspring that equals or exceeds it in other aspects, and repeat the process.

Genetic tests are extremely useful tools to help manage genetic disorders. Even when there is no test, or a known mode of inheritance, much can still be done to reduce the incidence of affected and carrier animals. The use of these guidelines can assist breeders in making objective breeding decisions for genetic-disease management, while continuing their breeding lines.
