

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

It's Spring, just kidding, April Fools! While we wait for the ridiculously overdue arrival of warm weather the 2018 AKC Point Schedules are out and in almost every region beardie numbers for conformation stayed the same or went down. Ask any beardie person and they will tell you majors seldom 'just happen'. If you want points, you must bring them yourself or coordinate with LOTS of other people to make it happen.

To further complicate matters, fewer and fewer people are showing their beardies in conformation, preferring to compete in agility, herding, obedience, etc. Now I fully realize there are any numbers of reasons for this, but as a breeder and handler I have seen far too many worthy dogs not finish their championship. By design, conformation is supposed to be the function by which we evaluate our current and future breeding stock and ensure a Bearded Collie stays looking like a Bearded Collie. As a proponent of our breed and our sport, I often ask people why they don't show their own dog in conformation. The reply I get is usually some version of, "I'm not coordinated enough to do that," "I'll make him look bad" or "I'll never beat the professionals." Anything worth doing takes time, dedication, and practice.

If knowledgeable breeders and owners are NOT exhibiting their correctly groomed and presented dogs, then professional handlers are the ones who control how our breed is viewed and presented to the rest of the dog show world. If we have an issue with handlers over grooming, presenting or incorrectly gaiting our breed, we must give the judges a correct alternative or else take full responsibility for the shift in course.

I am in no way maligning professional handlers, this is their livelihood and most do a fantastic job juggling multiple rings, breeds, clients and assistants while doing their best to present each dog to its best advantage on little to no sleep. The owner handler has many advantages over the professional, as you may have one or two dogs to train, condition, and groom and they are responsible for dozens. It does take effort and time to perfect your skills.

My first dog show picture is laughable! The grooming is atrocious, the dogs topline is scary, the foot placement is all wrong and I'm grinning like an idiot straight at the camera (hey, at least I was happy.) Those pictures didn't get better for years, but in each one I can see a slight improvement; my fingers aren't

covering the dog's face, the grooming is better, I had the stack closer to correct and other slight but notable improvements. Then I changed breeds and started learning all over again.

Learning anything new requires you to put yourself out there and take a risk. I see people flying though an agility course with more speed, precision and grace than I could dream of achieving. I see those who have worked stock for years making herding look effortless; it all comes down to practice, practice, embarrassment, and more practice.

Case in point, I had a herding lesson recently, the lesson was more for me than the dog as my experience in this venue it not nearly what I would wish it to be. I was trying desperately to figure out what I was supposed to be doing and look cool while keeping the dog happy and engaged. Then the sheep bolted, knocked my feet out from under me and I fell flat on my back. While the rest of the class who was watching tried hard not to laugh, my beardie had no such inhibitions. Her expression was a mix of mirthful glee and "I do not know that woman!" As I got up, brushing droppings from my jeans, back of my shirt and my hair, I am thinking I am done with this, DONE!

I was reminded of a time years ago in conformation when my new puppy peed in the judge's leather shoe during his examination, and the time I accidentally ripped out a wad of the judge's hair as she went over my dog and the incident when my shoe went flying off and hit a judge in the back of the head. Not to mention the numerous times I tripped over my dog or my own feet and fell in the ring. Yes, these things happened and every time I wanted to crawl in a hole and never come out, but then, like now, I still wanted to succeed. I wanted to prove to myself I could do it. So, embarrassment aside I will not give up on herding, and I hope those of you that make herding, agility, etc. look easy will not give up on conformation. We are such a fun and connected beardie family and that is our greatest resource. I'm always happy to share tips and/or embarrassing stories from the show ring, and hope you will share encouragements, insights, and humor from your favorite venue. We do this to have fun with dogs and experience new things, so have a good laugh and let's get busy learning!

Report of the Recording Secretary (Schroeder)

The minutes of the February 27, 2018 Board Meeting were approved as distributed.

REPORTS OF COMMITTEES

Judges Education Committee – The following items were submitted for the board's consideration.

- 1) To allow the newly formed Judges Education Committee to approach/recruit skilled breeders or owners to apply to be mentors.
- 2) To allow the newly formed Judges Education Committee to review and revise the Mentor Program criteria to help in recruitment of younger mentors as described in the Guidelines presented in late 2017 to the Board and retention of current members.
- 3) To move approval of new mentors from the BCCA Board to the Judges Education Committee beginning May, 2018.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

- 1) Motion to add Nicole Conner to the list of BCCA Approved Mentors (Judges Education Committee) passed with one abstention.
- 2) Motion to amend the BCCA 2018 Budget to reflect an increase of \$300/year to the website committee for improvements to our website (Bihl) passed without dissension.
- 3) Motion to rescind Standing Rule 9.6.4 (Obedience Committee) passed without dissension.
- 4) Motion to instate Standing Rule 9.6.4., as follows (Obedience Committee) passed without dissension.
 - 9.6.4 An Obedience Medallion is awarded to the top scoring bearded collie completing a CD, CDX or UD earned out of both A and B classes during the preceding year. If a dog earns a title out of both the A and B classes, the class in which the titling leg is earned, is considered the class competed in. A dog is eligible for the medallion only for the year it completes its title. The top scoring bearded collie in each class level (A and B) is the dog with the highest combined score of the three qualifying legs for the title. Qualifying scores do not have to be accumulated in a single year.
- 5) Motion to rescind Standing Rule 9.6.5 (Obedience Committee) passed without dissension.
- 6) Motion to instate Standing Rule 9.6.5., as follows (Obedience Committee) passed without dissension.

9.6.5 A Rally Medallion is awarded to the top scoring bearded collie completing a RN, RA, RE or RM title, earned out of both A and B classes during the preceding year. If a dog earns a title out of both the A and B classes, the class in which the titling leg is earned, is considered the class competed in. A dog is eligible for the medallion only for the year it completes its title. The top scoring bearded collie in each class level (A and B) or Rally Masters is the dog with the highest combined score of qualifying legs for the title. (Note: RN, RA and RE titles require three qualifying scores each; RM title requires ten qualifying scores.) Qualifying scores do not have to be accumulated in a single year.

- 7) Motion to rescind Standing Rule 9.4.9 (Prassa) passed without dissension.
- 8) Motion to instate Standing Rule 9.4.9, as follows (Prassa):

The Jack Award for Herding Excellence is awarded to the Bearded Collie that earns the highest average points on ducks. The crystal award is engraved with the winning year and dog's name, and presented to the owner each year for ten years, starting in 2017.

The data for calculating the award is taken from the official AKC Awards and are calculated as follows.

The three highest scores earned on ducks on any course at trials held within each calendar year shall be averaged to two decimal places;

The three highest number of dogs outscored on ducks on any course at trials held within each calendar year shall be averaged to two decimal places;

These average point counts shall be added together, the one dog with the highest point average shall be deemed the winner of the Jack Award.

Should a tie occur, it shall be broken as follows:

The dog whose scores and numbers come from a higher class or classes shall be declared the winner.

Should Provision #1 not break the tie, then the dog that has the most Highs In Trial throughout the calendar year shall be declared the winner.

If no prospective winner has attained a High in Trial win, then the number of Reserve High in Trial(s) or the higher average of class placements shall determine the winner.

- 9) Motion to accept the bid of Lilian Esposito for the 2018/2019 Beardie Bulletin (Conner) passed without dissension.
- 10) Motion to send Laura Colombo and Kathy Coxwell to the AKC Education Summit. (Schroeder) Motion to amend the motion as follows: Motion to send Laura Colombo to the AKC Education Summit with Kathy Coxwell as an additional attendee, space permitting, (Connor) passed without dissension. Motion to send Laura Colombo to the AKC Education Summit with Kathy Coxwell as an additional attendee, space permitting, (Connor) passed without dissension.
