BCCA BREED EDUCATION COMMITTEE SHORT TERM ACTION PLAN

1. Update the BCCA Breed Education Committee Responsibilities and send to the Board for approval.
2. Update seminar materials and handouts.
3. Make seminar and handout materials available on the BCCA website (under Activities tab, click on Conformation, click on Breed Education.)
4. Add video clips of beardies on the move, gaiting, single-tracking on the up and back, faults, etc. to materials available to judges and breeders and owners.
5. Develop and send a letter to AKC judges regarding trimming and sculpting.
6. Develop vignette/snapshot cards for the judges emphasizing seminal points of the standard.
7. Liaise with the BCCA Health Committee.
8. Promote use of courses for breeders and owners such as those offered by the Institute of Canine Biology (ICB) and Avidog. Both have courses available on line. ICB will offer

group rate reductions. One of Avidog's seminars is being offered at the 2019 National Specialty.

9. Update the breed public education brochure, "Beardie 101," and promote its use.
10. Expand availability of seminars and hands-on or ringside mentoring to affiliate specialties and larger show clusters.

11. Expand visibility of Breed Education and education available to breeders and owners through the Bagpipes, Bulletin, the website and social media. (There is a BCCA Breed Education Facebook group established).

SHEEP CAMP – FIDO'S FARM – 2019

SHARON PRASSA

We met Sunday afternoon for orientation. There were at least 100 attendees this year. Every person was assigned to a working group (usually five people) and given a schedule of where to be each day. We had a half-day assigned to an instructor, then the other half was "free" practice at any available station with whichever dog/dogs you wanted.

In addition, we were given our chores. Each morning, every group had an assignment to move sheep from one place to another of the various arenas. Moving sheep involved gathering them, gate sorting, and taking X number of sheep from where we were to another area. Our group was charged with putting three sheep each in Big Puppy and Little Puppy arenas, and six sheep

in Ryegrass, a field down a dirt path along a big ditch. Then we had to put the leftover sheep away in the holding area by our arena and leave out three for us to work.

Fido's is big with many areas available for work all the way from small puppy pen to Trillium (a huge, open field). One could practice on ducks, in an arena or open field. There are also various levels of sheep from heavy to very light.

My goal with Mae was to work on her flanks/outruns. She tends to slice in at the top and I want her to complete a nice, round circle when asked, no slicing. I learned tools to use later as I continue to practice the drill to accomplish that goal. Tools: sit dog, go to your sheep, Send dog. As dog goes around, you keep

up with dog and, if necessary, push her out if she starts to cut in. However, in doing this, I never needed to push her out. By maintaining my position about even with Mae's shoulder as she went around, that automatically kept her out. She can be as far away from the sheep as necessary (as we progress, her distance from the sheep will be greater) but mine will always be right with the sheep. Of course, heavier sheep are best to start this drill because they will stay put and I can walk around them as I keep up with Mae. After dog goes around a couple of times, change direction and go the other way. Once she gets the idea and does a nice circle, give her the sheep and walk around. Then do it again.

We got to do a bit of small space work in a pen and had a session about accomplishing straight fetches. It was in this session that other participants got to see the "other" side of Mae. For the straight fetch – this is something those of us doing arena work will have a hard time with because of the fences. Remember, the outrun is to position the dog behind the sheep, not to move the sheep. Hence, the dog must be far enough out, off the sheep's bubble to do this. Where one stops the dog at the "top" is also important. Watch the sheep's heads. They will tell you where that perfect point is. The lift is right where the dog influences the sheep to move and, hopefully, one has chosen the correct spot to start the lift. The fetch brings the sheep to you. As I mentioned, this is next to impossible in an arena because the dog cannot get out far enough to not move the sheep on the outrun. However, the dog can learn to take pressure off the sheep. Some do it naturally, others must be taught.

In our class, we were working on very basic stuff with pretty heavy sheep, so it was boring for others in the group to watch. In one fetch session, the sheep got away. I told Mae to Go Get Them. so off she went, barreling up the arena, reached the sheep and turned them, then brought them right back to me, ever so nicely. Chris, who owns Fido's and who was leading the class,



stood up, whooping and hollering with delight. "Did you see that dog bring back the sheep???? She never chased them, and Sharon had the trust in her to let her do her job."

I have to say, that made my week!! Folks got to see Mae in action, doing some very nice work.

I encourage anybody with an interest in herding (and close enough) to go to Fido's sheep camp. Where else can one have the opportunity to be on sheep or ducks for five days, with good instructors? No matter what level you are at (even just barely starting) there is a group appropriate for your dog's level. Or, if one dog gets tired and you have another, work that one!! No limit to how many dogs you can work.

Sheep camp also included breakfast, lunch and dinner each day, with activities after dinner if one wanted to participate. Many people camp onsite for sheep camp so the activities after dinner were perfect for them. I stayed at my house in Yelm, about 20 minutes away from sheep camp so by the time dinner was finished, I was ready to head home. So were the dogs!!



FROM MARY, GREER AND JAZZ

Pre-Camp. As I sit on here in the kitchen of a friend prepping myself to a week of friends, sheep and dogs, I realize deep down how fortunate I am to be able to do this. Due to a wrinkle in life I missed last year. Grear is now (hopefully) my working dog. Jazz will get to do chores and Coda may go take a look at ducks. My goal in camp, to help find ways to break thru Grear's rather obnoxious current style of yelling at me and not staying in contact with her job.

End of Day #2. Day two at camp is under our belt, this morning prepping to work day three. So many choices. such good information and for me such good support in working out issues with Ms Grear. The issue of insanity barking leads the parade,

and how I deal with it, a major part. I've let it tweak me way too many times, so the main task is really working on ME.

Man are these folks organized. It's such a HUGE undertaking: meals on time and very satisfying. The groups are beginning to gel as supportive friends, no matter the level, with the theory we all learn off each other and each dog is different. The coaches give us all equal time challenging but enabling us to move forward from the level we are at. The stock is super terrific.

End of Day #3. Today was also Duck day for me and while Grear is my "main dog" I'm allowed to bring another to class,. just can't switch off during class, .so Jazz is on board to see if we can revamp duck skills.

FUN day in that I put Gear up for the a.m. and Jazz got to go to Duck class. Love Suzanne Schwann, she's so comfortable on ducks and so willing to offer excellent communication. Jazz had a ball, and really for a dog that hasn't really seen ducks for almost three years, well, they don't forget. It was MY duck handling that needed fixing (of course).

Coda and Gear had a shot. Gear put aside her yelling for the most part and went to work, we both relaxed. Coda gets a little yeehaw in the corners but there is definite connection with the little buggers and that's a good thing.

So far the weather has held to doable for both stock and handlers. There are times when I think some of us would love to get in and wallow in the wonderfully clean stock tanks. Gear certainly did after a very late afternoon fairly peaceful go on a large flock nobody was working. Again, nice to walk away from something in relaxed format.

Today is actually the last full teaching day, tomorrow is Ranch Dog stuff out of the AHBA thinking and open field work with great setters and exhausters on deck.

My one downer is that no matter how much I thought I had brought the body back to working level, was that in all truth we're not there yet. I had to laugh, Suzanne kept reminding me to get up with my ducks. HA HA HA, quackers move better than I do. Phooey!

Thinking It All Over. I can't believe and remain respectful and awed by the level of patience, knowledge, and energy presented by our teachers and coaches. One teacher looked at her fit-bit, it registered 17 miles A DAY! Others, especially those in the smaller areas, have got to go home each day banged and bruised by us students putting sheep over the top of them one

FROM BARBARA, RORY AND MYST.

It is always both fun and a learning experience at Fido's Sheep Camp. It's the one time of year where many with various breeds that you see at different events during the year all come together. This year both Rory and Myst will participate with Myst at almost three being my primary dog for the first time.

Rory at nine would be a wonderful dog to work all aspects of ranch life. She is most relaxed when doing chores but Trialing, not so much. She'd only had intermittent training before we moved to Washington in 2017 but with consistent training since then has finished started, intermediate and many levels of advanced work in the last two plus years in AKC and AHBA. She has a LOT of eye for a Beardie which has caused problems in what she considers small arena spaces. She eyes the sheep, the sheep eye her. This year with her I am focused on my body language and what I do that helps create the pressure.

When working as sheep approach tight turn around me into a Drive. I need to STOP WATCHING MY DOG. I eye Rory, Rory eyes the sheep and the sheep eye the quickest exit route and then everything blows up. I was reminded to stop facing the dog full front and staring at her that increases pressure one hundred fold. Direct, release, turn away and trust your dog. Ugh, it's so hard. When I have someone talking in my ear and reminding me each step of the way everything goes so smoothly and easy but left on my own it's all such muscle memory. More practice for me and I am so grateful to the ever so patient Beardie.

way or another, and still they returned each day with a grin and willingness to take each dog, its issues and the handler on.

To all of you that made camp, so good to see you all, chat dogs, sheep, and yes other subjects (not often) and may the next year be one of another greeting and meeting.

This is the one shot I have of four of the five Beardies all hanging out at Sharon Prassa's Yelm house where I got to stay as a house guest. From front to back, Gear, Coda, Mae, Jazz. Missing Xavi, he was behind me. Down time from camp, all snoozing and at peace with their world.



Myst. I am refining started level techniques, pace, distance from sheep, cover. She tends to flatten almost imperceptibly at two and ten. The flattening causes her to come into balance behind the sheep about two - three feet away which makes the sheep feel rushed and pushes them too fast. I then spend my time trying to slow everything down and create a smooth fetch. When she releases (moves out) at two and ten she ends up about four to five feet at the balance point behind the sheep. The sheep feel



relaxed, I feel relaxed, so she relaxes and paces appropriately. I am going to be working at spotting those turn-in clues.

In the past I would just push into her a bit at two or ten and then let her have the sheep, which obviously was working. What we worked on at camp was to stop her as soon as I saw that slight shoulder dip that comes before her flattening and cutting in; then I walked into her until she gave a full release. I have no idea why I am so undisciplined that I am willing to accept almost right and then we never get to better. I am assured by the instructor that once she understands that with being on balance she always gets her sheep, it will make sense to her.

I always gauge what I've gotten out of Sheep Camp by how we do at trials the following year. First I can get the new and better

FROM WANDA AND ROXIE

Probably the most exciting thing is the Driving. She's learning to Drive, she's walking into pressure well, we are getting good solid flanks and we are getting better distance then we have gotten before. She is learning and coming along and I am really happy with it.

Even though we work with the one same Instructor at home we see a different side of her when she is working with other people. We've used between three sheep with one instructor and ten with another in a different area.

FROM DEB WITH STEVIE, ALICE AND ROSE.

Sheep Camp Orientation. So fun to see people I know yet see only rarely. All of us with the same goal. Set the real world aside for the week. Excited that my main instructor for Stevie will be Paul Murray, the person that has been helping me with her all along.

I will be taking the other dogs each day for free periods; a shedding clinic, a driving clinic and then sessions on small pen work, big field work, etc.

Will work Alice on leaving from my feet on ducks (aiming to eliminate her confusion on B course, "Ducks? Where?") Oh, and a whistle class, last sheep camp, after much work, I had gotten where I could occasionally produce sound, but not consistent and I couldn't figure out what I was doing that worked only some of the time.

The First day of Sheep Camp proved to be everything I was hoping for. First up, Stevie in the morning sessions with Paul Murray. She never lacks drive and enthusiasm! One of these days, control will be good. Our final session was in the round



behavior (for both me and my Beardies) during practice, then when I get it under stressful (for me) trialing I know we've got it.

arena with Paul working her. That went better, actually found a walk on balance.

Stevie

Rose had two sessions in the afternoon with Cynthia Mills in a not too big area (think HT size, for those that do AKC). She's had about a year off, since pretty much telling me the pressure was too much to cover running sheep. I was happy that she was very willing to work.

We took a break and then worked with Dave Larson in the small pen sort area. Dave worked her first, again happy and except for not taking a Sit or Stop, she was happy to work for him. Then I worked her. Very nice. Fingers crossed; I can bring her back.

Ended the day with Alice doing some lovely work on ducks, with Suzanne. The girl is going to become a downright good duck dog! Wanting to work on leaving from my feet to ducks in a round cage, aiming for B course ducks. When I've tried her on B course at trials, she hasn't "found" the ducks 'way' down field. She had a lovely deep Outrun, but then was too pushy on the ducks. So, I moved closer, so I could control the lift. Much

better. We put them in the free-standing pen after each lift and I was really happy how well she remembered how to do this! With that and great lunch and dinner plus talking with so many old and new friends - awesome day! Dogs are all sacked out. Off again tomorrow! Looking forward to the shedding clinic!

Day 2. Alice started the day with a two-hour shedding clinic by Chris. I was really pleased with her try. We had a few issues, not really associated with the shed, but with working a large mob of pretty light sheep. I spent some time on helping remind her that wider flanks were better. But we did get a few very nice "call throughs" and flank behind with a stop. (We also got a few, "don't worry, I'll put them back together").

Stevie and I had a great afternoon session with Paul. I got to step up (and, woohoo, kept standing up) and work her myself in the round pen. Go between the fence and the sheep, no problem. Change directions, no problem. Go really fast, no problem. AND she even took two sits! (That's two more than she has ever taken on sheep before!). She was still distracted a bit by sheep in pens sharing the fence line, but only briefly.

At the end of the day, Alice got to do some nice real farm work moving sheep from small pens and a larger arena, into their nighttime spot. I was so happy with how she worked, quietly controlling the sheep. Ended the evening with a great Taco/Burrito dinner. Now must go to bed before midnight!!

Day 3. Another great day. Stevie in the morning with Dave Larson; three sheep in a corner. Working on blocking to get a pause, then "open the door" to let her flank around. Balancing, building drive and lightly applying the pressure of rules. Keeping 13-month-old baby dog in mind. Great tips on my body language, keeping stock stick use quiet, in neutral when appropriate. She got distracted a few times by sheep action in the next pen. Carefully trying to determine if this was a stress response or baby brain "squirrel!" I was pleased to see that when she took the sheep out of the corner, even when they split a bit, she every time went around to bring the splitter back rather than try to further 'cut it out'. Most of the time she held a Sit, so I could back up to the sheep. Really happy with how far we have come in three days. She was still trying to go back in after our last round today.

Alice had two sessions. First was small take pens. Happy with her nice quiet work. Really good lessons for me on working small pens. Then with Cynthia on outruns. Alice too often crosses over, which is an NQ. Again, a learning lesson for me; i.e. how an obstacle like a free-standing pen, can suck a dog in, rather than push it out like I had planned!

Rose got the final lesson of the day. Small pens with Paul. The plan is to bring her back, from too much pressure land. What became acutely, and a bit painfully, obvious, was that I am the pressure. Rose worries too much about what I think, she wants to please and be right. I really must be very careful with my body language and voice! She is such a tough girl in other areas. But we did get some nice pen work done. Then she got to do some evening chores. We took sheep out of the small pens, a field and drove them down to spend the night in the A course arena. Love doing chores! Having such a wonderful time, just sitting around talking to folks about dogs and herding, and lots of other things. So enjoyable! Weather has been perfect so far.

Day 4. Alice did more work in small pens. five big woolly sheep, a dog and two people, then close the gate and calmly move the sheep around without getting squished. It turned out well. And thank you Dave Larson for such good input on 'neutral stock stick', that I tend to not pay attention to the position of my stock stick, putting pressure on the dog when it is inappropriate, insights into sheep and also reading my body language. It was great!

Rose up in Big Arena with a large flock of fairly light sheep. Working to let her know she can do no wrong if she is working sheep. Very apparent she wants to work. Started doing a nice job of driving. She broke into a gallop to Get Around, several times. I tried to keep my verbals to Get Your Sheep and a few Get Arouns. Even praise will make her stop. Hard for me, my natural tendency is to yahoo her galloping to cover sheep, but that will (and did) stop her. Thank you, Cynthia Mills.



Rose

And then a session just for humans. A whistle class with Chris. I must admit I was only able to make any noise twice, but I do want to learn to whistle. Chris showed us the different commonly used whistles for the basic commands and how you vary them, for example to speed up, let the dog know it will be a long flank or a short one, etc. now I just have to figure out how to make noise!!!

Afternoon was our group with Paul Murray. Stevie has had a long week, not only lessons each day, but just being in her crate the other half. My goal with her is slow and steady. So we only worked one time today in the round pen and it went well. One more day tomorrow. Already planning to attend next year. I highly recommend it to anyone really interested in herding. It's worth a long drive!

Last day. A final lesson with Trudy Viklund for Rose, who is showing a nice square flanks, trying a new exercise to build her confidence that it's OK to gallop and cover running sheep. Two years ago, I left Sheep Camp with the feeling that I just needed to be glad Rose had done so wonderfully getting her AKC Started title, before she shut down, unable to handle the pressure. (Long story, but at a critical age, she had a bad experience where she decided that people got very upset if you tried to cover a running sheep). I have not worked her on stock for a year. But I kept thinking about how she wanted in the arena, so brought her to sheep camp. Feeling much more optimistic after this week. I think I can say without a doubt, that she wants and likes working sheep. If I walk into an arena with her and take her lead off, she immediately goes to the sheep. With the help of several instructors, this week, I came away with ideas and tools to free her up. Feeling hopeful! Thank you, Paul Murray, Dave Larson, Cynthia Mills and Trudy Viklund!

Sheep Camp is over for the year. Already planning to be there next year. Who's going to join me?

Yesterday, one of the frequent attendees spoke at the lunch break, wanting to thank Chris for all she does to organize and open her facility for camp. It was a wonderful speech and part of it was about the Community that sheep camp forms. We come back for the learning, for the week of working with our dogs, but also the community of people that find these things valuable and important. Most of us don't live on sheep farms. We don't need herding dogs to make it through the day, and yet we love this to our core. We are an eclectic group, with sheep dogs, our bond. Awesome.

I've had so many great moments this week. Many of them about training me. (Anyone that does this seriously, knows that way over 50% of the issues are the handler/trainer, not the dog). I came away with some new exercises, tools, ideas on how to shape behavior, how to explain, how to work my dogs.

Now back to the real world and real work.
