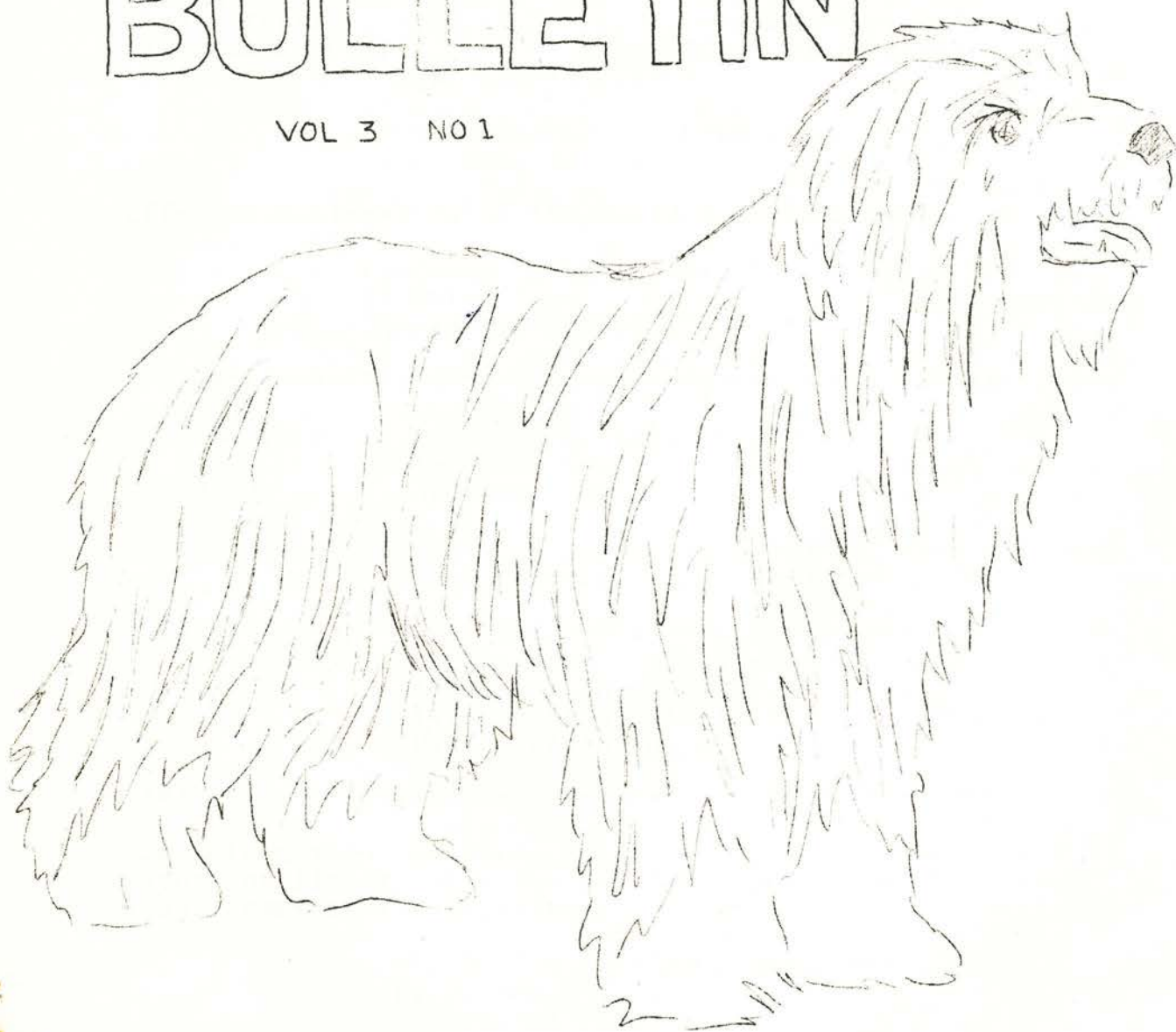

The resulting puppies are often sold out of state.

It is practically an unavoidable situation we face. And yet I now wonder if it is a safe procedure to follow. I'm sure many other owners must be wondering as we are, if the story is a bleak as the article indicates. I think you would perform a service if you were to expound on this problem to your readers.

To the Beardie Bulletin Editor and readers, from a very discouraged member.

It is rumoured that the B.C.C.A. does still exist, and I have a notice about dues being due, but have no intention of sending my cheque to anyone until I have some indication that there actually is a club.

No bulletins have been sent to or reached me since one was given to me by another member in September, 1972.

Are there meetings?

How can I meet other members?

What can I tell other interested people who phone me and those who buy dogs from my kennel about the mythical B.C.C.A.? One member tried to nominate me for the board elections (sic) but since he didn't even know when they were until his bulletin arrived three days before the extended cutoff date, it was impossible to get signatures of five other members and send anything off.

And I once heard, too late, of a member in the New York area who tried to start a New York regional chapter. I would have dropped everything and gone had I ever been notified. Eventhough (sic) I had two dogs entered in a show that day and my older Beardie bitch entered on exhibition.

So who are the people who go with the names? And if they don't have time to make this a real Club instead of a dead end correspondence pool, why don't they let some of the people who are willing to make the time do something?

We now have new blood, interested people, who may have a lot to offer, but before they've even met another member they get the impression that the "Club" is run by a small group of aloof, unfriendly, geographically widely separated individuals who barely communicate among themselves, let alone with any of the common element of members.

None of us know all that much about our Beardies genetic makeup, but how will we find out if we can't compare notes? And how can we ever expect to get even Misc. classification, let alone A.K.C. recognition with our present lack of communication?

As one who has worked professionally with many breeds of dogs and other animals, an avowed lover of Bearded Collies and a member of many other clubs and societies which I would gladly forego for the good of, or time to devote to the B.C.C.A. I ~~xxxxxxx~~ respectfully submit my requests to the members at large through the Beardie Bulletin, and if I do not receive a copy of the next Bulletin, with this letter in it, or a promise of its publication, within the next two months, I will have copies made and sent out to the membership myself.

THE PREVENTION OF HIP DYSPLASIA IN BEARDED COLLIES

Hip Dysplasia (usually abbreviated H.D.) is a malformation of the pelvis in which the hip socket is too shallow to hold the leg in place. The afflicted dog can have varying degrees of H.D. from a mild form only diagnosable by X-ray, to a condition so severe that a step cannot be taken without pain.

To date, very few Bearded Collies suffer from the more extreme symptoms of H.D. And yet, in some breeds, the disease is so prevalent that as many as 35% exhibit varying degrees of the condition.

In the past, only the Whippet and Greyhound were thought free of H.D. However, now it is a confirmed fact that no breed is clear. The first case of Hip Dysplasia in Bearded Collies was diagnosed in England about five years ago.

It is now known that H.D. is an inherited neuromuscular disease that cannot be diagnosed, except radiographically after the dog reaches one year of age. You cannot look at a dog and decide whether it has mild H.D. or not. The mild degree of H.D. that would show up as lameness after a week's work bringing in sheep doesn't trouble a dog who is only getting four or five miles exercise a day. If that dog is bred from, however, some of his progeny will be slightly worse. They in turn are bred from and somewhere in the succeeding generations the first animals that cannot move at all without pain are going to appear. It would be irresponsible to assume that because we can't see it yet, it isn't serious in Beardies. Ther German Shepherd Dog people said that, and now it is difficult to obtain a shepherd that is free of H.D.

Miss Carol Gold, President of the Bearded Collie Club of Canada published in their magazine, The Bearded Colleague, a list of what she called vital necessities for the Bearded breeder:

- "1. X-ray all your breeding stock....dogs and bitches! You are walking blindfolded in a minefield if you don't know how your own dogs stack up. Don't breed your dogs until you have had them X-rayed.
2. Don't breed to a dog who hasn't been X-rayed. If the dog's owner doesn't care enough about the breed to check, then he shouldn't have a stud dog.
3. Don't breed two affected dogs together.
4. Don't import a puppy until you have found out the H.D. status of his parents and grand-parents."

The Bearded Collie Club of America will do its part to insure the prevention of the spread of this disease by publishing in all future issues of the Beardie Bulletin a list of dogs that have been certified clear of H.D. by the Orthopedic Foundation for Animals (OFA). You, as a potential breeder and lover of the breed, can do your part by having your stock X-rayed and by sending copies of the plates to the OFA for interpretation. The address is:

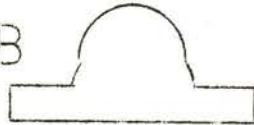
