believe Amber's milk was the deciding factor.

Having two mothers was both humorous and sad at times. Both mothers escorted me every time I did anything with Tiger and both obviously worried about him. I though everything was coming along just dandy, when one day Joli (the natural mother) decided she wanted her puppy back! She leaped over the barrier dividing the two whelping boxes (Joli can leap tall buildings with a single bound) to retrieve him. As she did this, Amber (the foster mother) grabbed Tiger in her mouth and took off with him! Now, this is what is really interesting...Amber knew exactly which puppy Joli was after and left her other natural puppies unattended to take off with Tiger! We spent some frantic time looking for this little tiny puppy that could be hidden in the smallest of hiding places. My mind was racing as I hunted: "Oh no, after all our efforts to save him, he's going to die in some cubby hold where we can't find him!" I was out looking in our 1/2 acre of land underneath rocks and in holes and behind bushes while Jimmy searched the house. Fortunately, Jimmy heard him "mewing" and located him behind a chair buried in a wool shawl. However, it now meant we had to be on the lookout for the two bitches to be stealing him from each other. "No rest for the weary" is how the saying goes, I think.

After about five weeks, we felt Tiger was definitely going to make it. One thing that led me to believe this was the fact that he was the dominant puppy out of BOTH litters. I discovered this by accident. I was, by now, feeding them myself in two big wooden bowls. One time, after setting them down, I heard some growling and observed the following scenario: although there were two big wide bowls, most of the puppies were crowded in one while several puppies were sitting watching the second bowl where Tiger was calmly eating all by himself. I watched for several minutes. If a puppy ventured near the bowl Tiger was eating at, his head never moved...you saw his jaw stop chewing...then you heard...grrrrowff!!! Ant the puppy backed away! If one did become brave enough to actually attempt to eat out of the bowl...well, then, his whole body moved and he flew at them and they promptly retreated. I felt that if both litters were willing to accept him as their leader (all the puppies became visibly upset if he was taken out of their area as they got older) there surely couldn't be anything seriously wrong with him! It would be against their pack instinct to allow a weak or sickly puppy to dominate them.

I had decided by this time that Tiger was definitely going to make it. Another decision was made...Tiger would not be going to another home...there was no way I could part with this puppy after what we had been through together! We've had many offers to purchase him, including people in other breeds that are show

people. Some Sheltie people felt "he was just their size Beardie." Ever since this happened, every place I go, or if people are on the telephone, the first thing that is said is a question: "How is Tiger?" He has quite a fan club now...across the U.S.

We've had him to several vets and they all agree that we don't really know what happened to him internally during that "cold state" he was in for so many hours. Rather his pituitary gland and/or other organs may have been affected so that he hasn't grown in size like his brothers and sisters or if he will ever catch up. Right now, he is still half the size of his brothers and about 2/3 the size of this sisters. We only know that he is a very special puppy that is very bright and mature for his age.

I took him to the Specialty in Georgia and entered him in the costume contest dressed, of course, as a tiger! One of my students made him a tiger costume complete with a tail and two fuzzy ears!

In closing, I would add one other thing. We had difficulty with his weight and appetite at about three months of age. We put him on rice, boned chicken, and K-Zyme powder. This perked his appetite up immediately and he is now back on dog food, but we continue to put the K-Zyme in. He is now a solid, definitely healthy puppy.
